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

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- Content that is appropriate, in scope and level, for the conference
- Clearly written original material that addresses a new and important problem
- Valid methods and rationale
- Conclusions that make sense
- Illustrations, tables and graphs that support the text
- References that are current and relevant to the subject





- The content is not a good fit for the publication
- There are serious scientific flaws:
 - Inconclusive results or incorrect interpretation
 - Fraudulent research
- It is poorly written
- It does not address a big enough problem or advance the scientific field
- The work was previously published
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4.会议论文改投期刊-以 IEEE Sensors Journal 为例

- The IEEE Sensors Journal encourages authors who have published at recent technical symposia, meetings and conferences to submit expanded, archival quality versions of their conference papers.
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会议论文修改指导

- Use feedback obtained at the conference to update, revise, and rewrite the paper, as appropriate, to *improve the paper's overall quality*.
- Add new material to your paper. Typically, your conference paper will grow to 8 pages, which allows the inclusion of new text, figures and data.
- Include a footnote in the submitted manuscript stating, e.g., "An earlier version of this paper was presented at the XYZ Conference and was published in its Proceedings." and include a web-link to the already published paper.
- Highlight the new sections, figures, etc. in the expanded manuscript to expedite processing.
- Provide a copy of the original conference paper (upload an additional PDF file during the submission process).

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Student Paper Contest

Contest Details

All IEEE student members are invited and encouraged to enter the IGARSS 2013 Student Prize Paper Competition. Ten finalists will be selected by a committee to present their papers during a special session at the symposium in Melbourne. All finalists will be offered partial travel support funding. Three prizes will be presented: First Prize (Mikio Takagi Student Prize) endowed with US\$ 1000.00, Second Prize endowed with US\$ 750.00, Third Prize endowed with US\$ 500.00, plus certificates for each.

To enter, a student should have submited the following documents **online at the abstract submission page** by January 10, 2013:

- 1. A full, final, camera-ready paper formatted according to the paper kit section on final papers;
- 2. A signed letter from a faculty advisor stating that the student:
 - · is a candidate for a degree and IEEE student member,
 - will personally present the paper if accepted,
 - will publish in the IGARSS 2013 Proceedings,
 - will register and participate in the symposium, and
 - will attend the Awards Banquet (free ticket provided by Local Organizers to every finalist);
- 3. Proof of your student status.

Contest guidelines:

- 1. The first/principal author must be a student.
- 2. The student must be an IEEE member.
- 3. Each student can only submit one paper for consideration in the contest.
- 4. The student must be in a degree program at the time of submission of IGARSS 2012 paper.
- 5. The student must attend IGARSS 2013 and present the paper.
- 6. The student will publish the paper in the IGARSS 2013 Proceedings.
- The full paper MUST BE FORMATTED ACCORDING TO THE PAPER KIT and must be uploaded through the online system by January 10, 2013.





- To qualify for student travel support, the applicant must be the first author and a full-time student.
- The student must be a member of IEEE or have a letter of endorsement from an IEEE member.
- Requirements:
 - Completed travel support application
 - Copy of IEEE student membership card or letter of endorsement from an IEEE member

- IEEE groups that produce or co-sponsor conferences.
- Conference organizers live and work in many different countries around the world. They frequently hold other positions within their Section, Chapter, or Society.

- Most conferences start preparing a minimum of 12 to 18 months before the conference date.
- Some of the pre-planning is done before you apply to IEEE for approval, such as getting sponsorship and defining the technical program.
- Many IEEE organizational units (Section, Societies, Technical Councils, etc.) have their own processes that must be completed to obtain sponsorship approval.
- Best practice has shown that earlier engagement with IEEE results in smoother execution and a simpler path for the conference committee.
